Full research papers with a title page, abstract, keywords, main text, tables, figures, references etc. should be submitted through Conference Maker. Use Times New Roman with 12-point font size and double spaced. For blind review process, all author-identifying information must be removed before submission. Link for submission: bit.ly/2XEKpwq

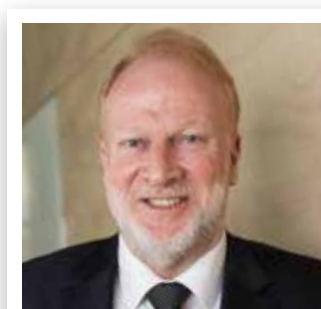
Economics: Inclusive growth and development, climate change, Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), international trade, employment, and other key issues in public policy making in emerging countries.

The symposium sub-themes mentioned above are indicative and research papers on other related topics are also welcome.

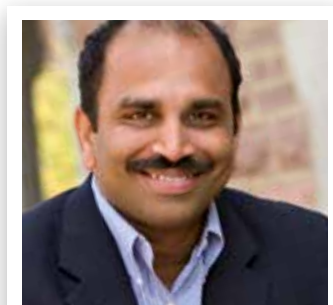
